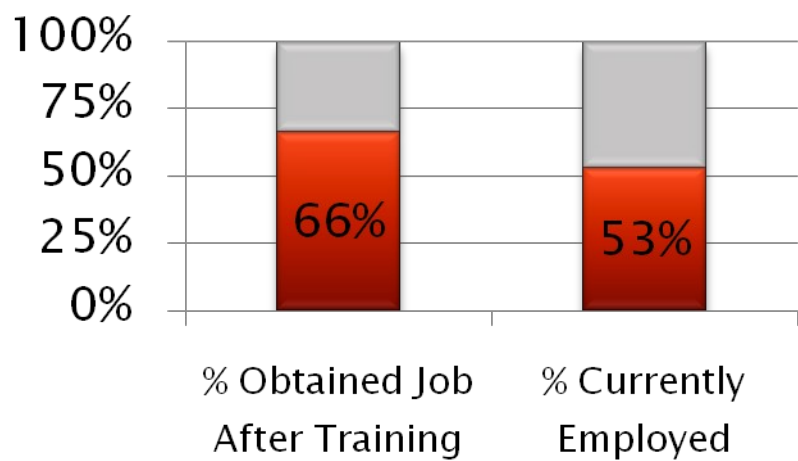
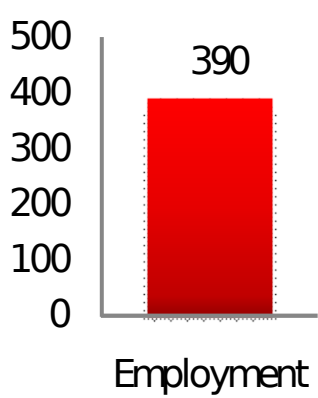
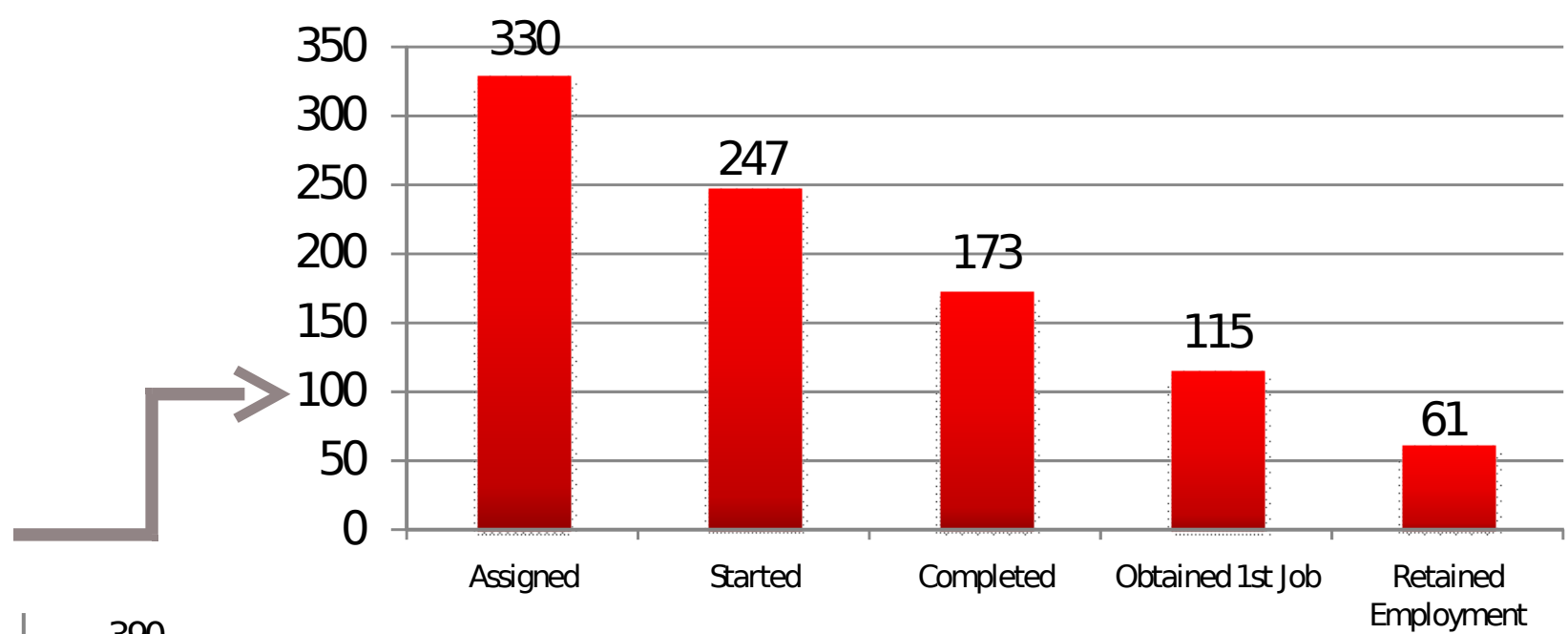

  - Over 400** individuals have contacted Street Advocates for services

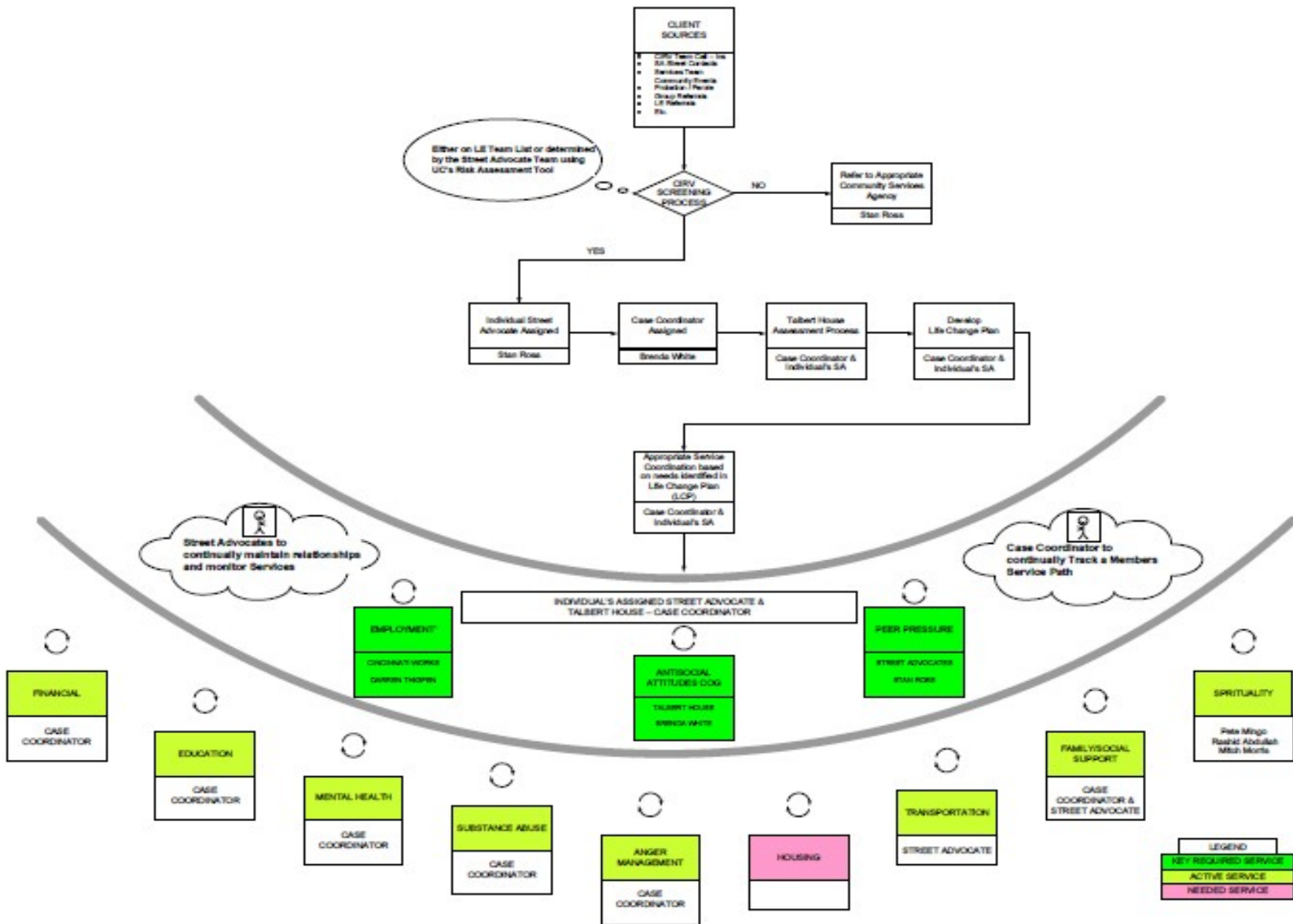

  - Monitoring and tracking client progress

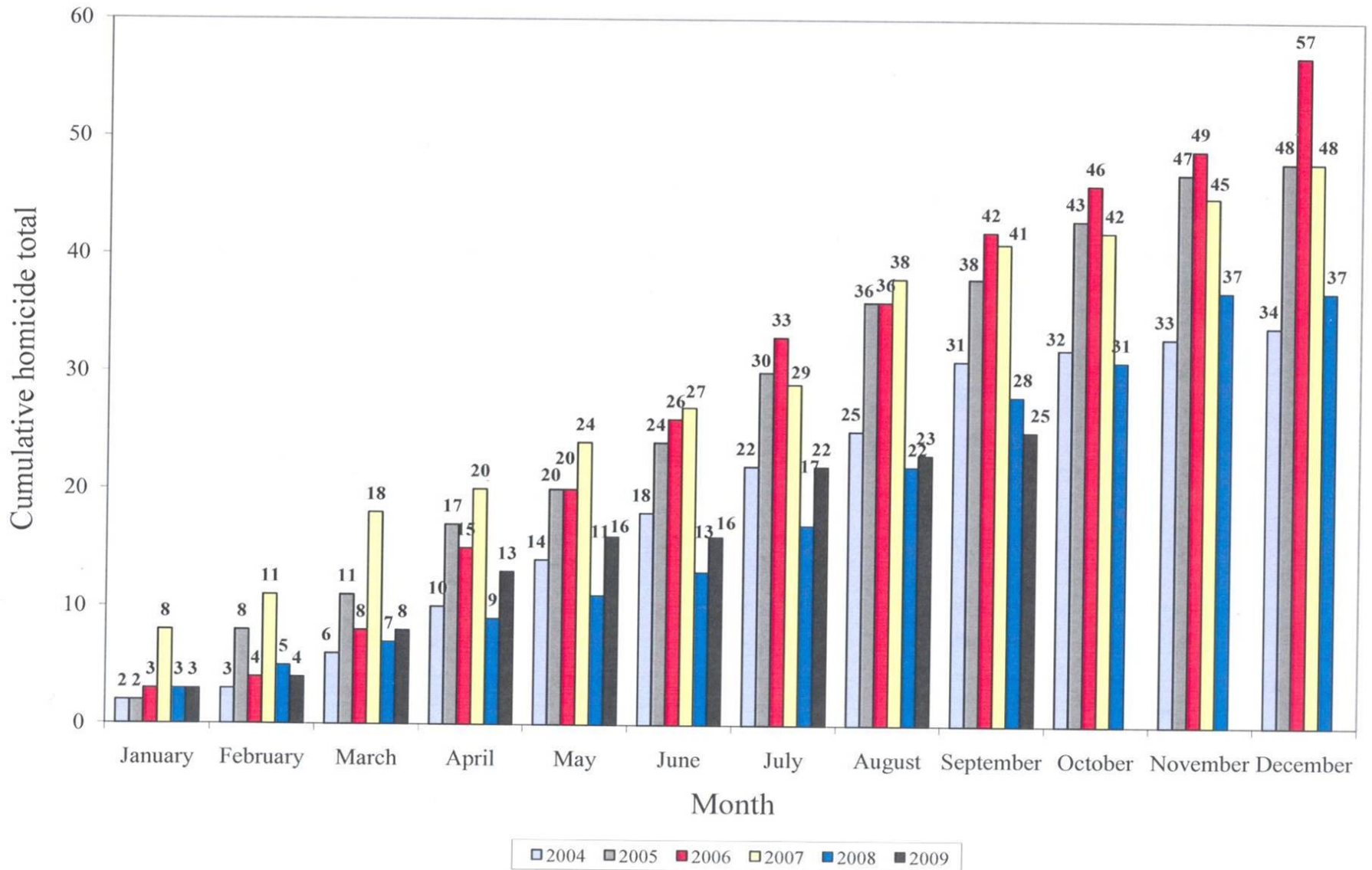
# CIRV SERVICES PROCESS DIAGRAM

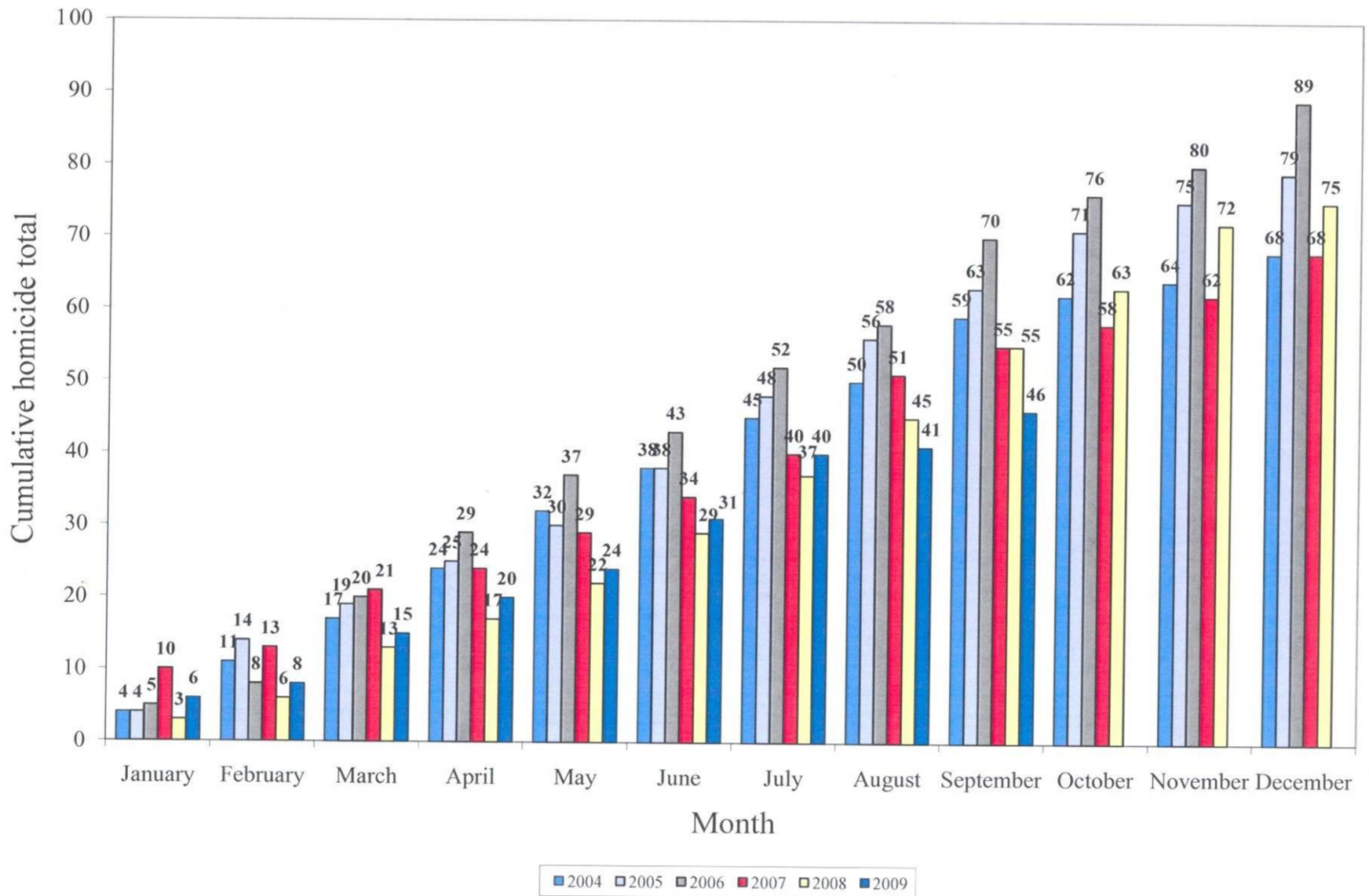

# Cincinnati Cumulative Group Member Involved (GMI) Homicide Totals By Month, 2004-2009

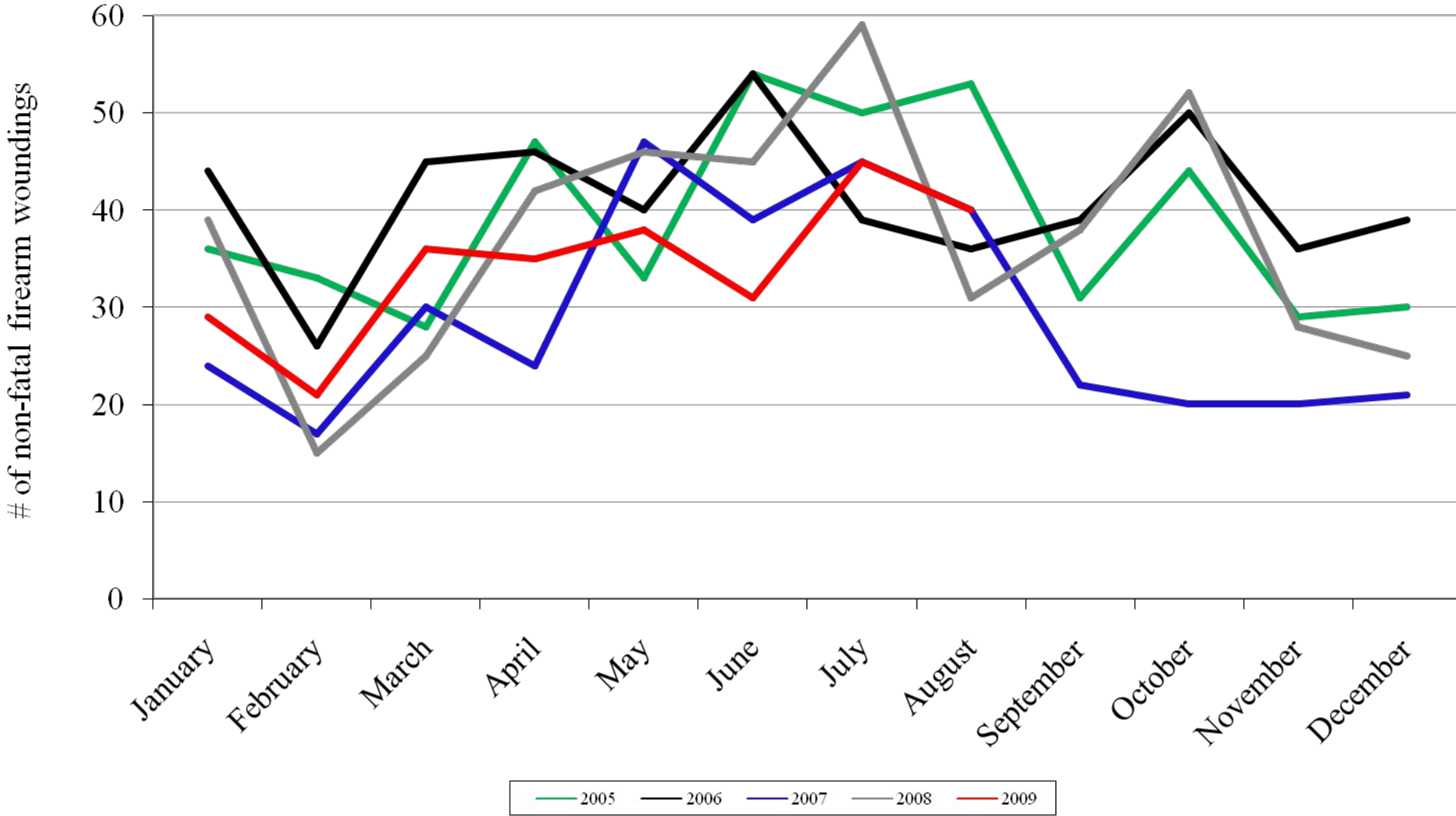




# Monthly Cumulative Homicide Totals in Cincinnati, 2005-2009
