





Deliverables Office of Violence Prevention Community Engagement

CEC DM met with three mothers of young men and women involved with gangs and have been ceasefire clients. Meeting was three hours long and mothers agreed to be a positive example to the streets and high risk youth & young adults. The mothers adopted the name "Maverick Mothers" and DM will facilitate regular meetings and service & speaking opportunities. MM (Maverick Mothers) can be of a great benefit to strategic operations.

CEC DM held the 6th meeting with 15 area high school girls to discuss conflict resolution and violence prevention. Meetings are productive. Two girls are associated with possible gang.

CEC DM has met with female youth identified in being leader of issues at the mall. Meetings are ongoing. Youth has switched schools & raised grades. DM signed youth up for summer basketball league and youth will also participate with boxing program at McKinley. Youth vowed to put down gang life.

CEC DM has ongoing information sharing communication with LT Telly.

Office of Violence Prevention Community Engagement Cont.

DM and Supervisor Walden met & toured the McKinley Community center. DM spoke about holding OVP Role Model Mentoring training at center and later setting up programming for current girls program. Walden would also like a Peacekeeper to hold desk space in field. Planning is ongoing and will have more information at next Icap.

DM had the honor of Introducing LT Kathryn Nance & others at the "Women in Blue" event that was held April 25th. Chief Jones gave words of wisdom and closed out the program nicely. We should all be proud of the contributions we make serving within the Criminal Justice Field & LT Nance is a positive LE representative.











Monthly Forecast Zones PARK





UROJAS Family Living

Summary: Illegal transitional living facility. 24/7 Fire watch assigned, substandard conditions, Administrative Hearing is scheduled for June 7

#2: 616 East Anderson Street



Owner Nisha – Vacant Single Family Residence

Summary: Ongoing code violations. Property owner is unresponsive and owns numerous blighted properties in the City that are recorded in different names. This property is continually having trash dumped on it and is found to be occupied by transients.

#3: 8507 Acapulco Way



Vacant Duplex

Summary: On going code enforcement case: The property has had multiple interior fires. Transients often move from the slough located behind the property into this structure. The property owner is unresponsive and blames the City for the condition of this property.

#4: 1825-1833 Pacific Ave



Empire Theater

Summary: Ongoing violations for work without building permits, dangerous conditions, and structural issues. Property owner charged over \$150,000 in fines.

#5: 118-130 E. Fremont St, 931 N Madison St.





Owner Villalobos – Commercial Property

Summary: Ongoing Code Enforcement Issues. Commercial property with numerous zoning issues and illegal occupancy. Hostile Tenant and unresponsive property owner. Properties have been assigned for receivership.


#6: 582 West Ninth Street

Summary: The property was vacated in 2004 and is currently undergoing rehabilitation. This process began in 2012. The property is currently fenced and secured. \$37,800 charged in fines. \$200.00 daily fines ongoing. City requiring cash bond for the property owner to obtain permits.



#9: 712 North Commerce Street




5 Unit Apartment Complex
