


City of Detroit - Overview

Basic Facts


- Population: 672,975 (2017 Estimate)
- Area: 11 Police Precincts across 143 square miles
- Violence: Homicide Rate nearly 10x national average; overall violent crime rate nearly 5x national average


Enforcement Team

In 2016 and Q1 2017:

• 6% decrease in homicides & non-fatal shootings in Ceasefire Precincts in 2016 and Q1 2017.

In 2016 and Q1 2017:

- 1245 targeted arrests
- 227 Call-in attendees
- 129 custom notifications
- 48 federal indictments
- 57 cases filed in the state system
- **33.3% recidivism rate** (All 2016 Call-in attendees, events are contacts with police as suspects or arrestees)




Ceasefire Precincts – Homicides and Non-Fatal Shootings (Cumulative)




Ceasefire CompStat

During the first quarter, Ceasefire Units on average had **60 group-focused** enforcement actions.

In the first quarter, on average **53%** of Ceasefire Unit's actions were group-focused.






Ceasefire First Quarter CompStat 1/1/17 – 3/31/17

Services and Outreach Metrics

Services and Outreach Teams

Because of the services and outreach program in 2016 and Q1 2017:

- 29 Jobs received by Ceasefire clients
- 74 unique individuals served

In 2016 and Q1 2017 there were:

- **5 individuals** working on obtaining GED or High School Diploma
- 5 individuals obtained or in process of obtaining drivers license
- 4 individuals obtained housing
- 422 services interactions with individuals to improve life skills
- 333 interactions with street outreach workers
- Additionally, teams regularly respond to crime scenes, provide counsel and support to victims' families, deescalate conflict to prevent retaliation, and promote community healing through peace walks and candlelight vigils
